Music the Soundtrack of Our Lives

The second Sunday of April we will begin a new Worship Series here at Trinity Heights United Methodist Church. The Series will be focused on the music of our lives. This is a piece I wrote a few years ago that still resonates deep within me as I reread it again this morning. In preparation for the New Worship Series, *The Soundtrack of Our Lives; Faith and the Power of Music*, here is a bit from my heart of music to yours.

An outward and visible sign of an inward and spiritual grace – sacrament. In the United Methodist Church, there are two official sacraments, communion and baptism. We believe there is something about these to rituals, these two acts that carry us to another place, so to speak. They are in the mystery of the Divine, thin places where real and tangible encounters with God in community can and do happen. I believe this, on levels that defy words I have experienced such thin places where somehow, someway the present moment melds into the very presence of God, the Spirit, and have been carried away into another place of nothing but pure inexplicable love and grace. Other religious traditions have additional official sacraments. The Catholic church includes, baptism, communion, confirmation, reconciliation, anointing of the sick, marriage, and holy orders. These fit into the same definition and realm of mystery and encounter with the divine.

These definitions and markers of sacrament are important in my faith journey. However, I have long been one who refuses to limit the presence or reach of God. I believe one can encounter an outward and visible sign of an inward and spiritual grace in innumerable places, spaces, ways, and practices; sitting on a granite rock in the Rocky Mountains, drinking a cup of coffee with my faithful dog curled up at my feet, in a sanctuary filled with pipe organ music, at a rock and roll concert, the sounds of a baby, laughing uncontrollably around a table playing a game with family, or saying goodbye as a loved one takes their last breath. God is not limited to what we might call the reverent, solemn, occasions, rather God is present in all that has been, is, or will be. I am reminded of Elizabeth Barrett Browning's words, "Earth's crammed with heaven, and every common bush afire with God, but only he who sees takes off his shoes; The rest sit round and pluck blackberries."

Music, not faith-based music, but the pop music that is currently playing on our airwaves and the music I grew up with can be sacramental that carries us to places we have been before and places we have never dreamed of. I think of songs like Chicago's "I've Been Searching so Long," and how it speaks deep to my heart and soul on this current journey I am on. "As my life goes on, I believe, somehow something's changed. Something deep inside, ooh a part of me. There's a strange new light in my eyes, things I've never known changing my life, changing me." I think of Joan Osborn's song, "What if God was One of Us," and how it encourages me to look beyond myself and into others to see the light and image of God in all I encounter. "If God had a name, what would it be? And would you call it to his face? If you were faced with Him in all His glory. What would you ask if you had just one question? What if God was one of us? Just a slob like one of us? Just a stranger on the bus, tryin' to make his way home?" I think of George Harrison's "My Sweet Lord," that speaks to me of seeking that same light of the Divine in my siblings who practice other religious traditions or no faith tradition at all. "My sweet Lord, Oh, my Lord, My sweet Lord, I really wanna be with You, I like to see You, Lord, Oh, it takes so long."

The list is far too long of the songs that take me to another place, deep inside my mind, heart, and soul, or force me to look beyond into the world, places, spaces, faces of those I meet along the journey of life and faith.

Christian Scharen, I believe, speaks to this sacramental experience of God in all there is in his chapter on "Secular Music and Sacramental Theology" in the book "Secular Music & Sacred Theology" edited by Tom Beaudoin when he writes,

"Lady Gaga draws upon the baptismal sensibility of dying and rising, saying no to the inequality that makes some powerful and others marginal, and saying yes to a God-given equality and created goodness. Her embrace of design, costume, and dance performance lend an explicit sense of creative freedom to her call to be true to God's creative intentions for each person. Esperanza Spalding's intimate and passionate merger of instrument and song evokes a joining not unlike communion, become one body with musical forbears (Eddie Harris and Miles Davis), musical community in the present (Bobby McFerrin, the band, the audience) and the depth of her connection to God whose creative gifts overflow as healing and joy in the midst of it all. The word and sacrament of pop music gospel, sung and played for the sake of the gathered assembly of believers, a gathered assembly at the Grammys who despite their music industry status are nevertheless continually taken out of the moment and transported to that other place. A place where time shifts to no time and one can join in a communal experience of music with body and soul."

This diverse expression of the Divine presence is a worshipful experience soothing our soul, healing for our mind, body, and spirit. Seeking the Beloved Community is about knowing and experiencing God in all there is. The spark, the light, the image of the Divine in the diverse, rainbow tapestry of humankind. We find that diversity in the gathered community in so many ways, and for me I feel it so deeply in the sacrament of music. It is part of who we are, it is who we are as we walk and dance to the rhythm of the universe, the rhythm of the Divine.
